What drives profit in a livestock enterprise? How is it measured? How can livestock returns be compared in a cropping enterprise?

For growers looking to gain skills and knowledge on how to evaluate livestock profitability and investigate new management strategies. Targeted to a range of businesses including mixed farmers, with small or large livestock components, and continuous cropping growers interested in livestock integration.

This is the first of a series of technical workshops delivered for the NLP Project: Livestock Integration for Resilient Cropping Systems. Growers participating in the workshop will join a Local Producer Group, involving a series of four workshops across 2021, and 2022.

Topics covered in this workshop include:

- Understanding key profit drivers of livestock and cropping enterprises. Including:
 - Enterprise level benchmarks
 - Effective integration considerations for a mixed enterprise
- Rigorous analysis of livestock gross profit, including effective allocation of variable and overhead costs; and valuing inventory changes
- Comparing paddock level profitability of livestock and cropping enterprises
- Valuing various livestock feed sources to optimise profitability
- Evaluating capital investment options in livestock infrastructure
